TSNE Missionworks and Community Builders Get **Funding for National Projects**

TSNE MissionWorks Two Boston-based nonprofits which work nationally in addition to locally, TSNE

MissionWorks and The Community Builders, recently were awarded \$1.3 million from the George Gund foundation to support projects in Ohio.

THE C MMUNITY TSNE Missionworks, which provides **BUILDERS** management support and capacity building services to nonprofits in Massachusetts and across the country, received a two-year, \$500,000 grant for the Ohio-BUILD State Partnership, while The Community Builders, one of the nation's largest real estate developers, received a grant of \$800,000 for the Woodhill Homes community in Cleveland.

Mass. PPD Fund Receives \$15K for Parent Support **Groups**



Mass. PPD Fund, a Boston-based nonprofit that seeks to raise awareness of postpartum depression and other perinatal mental health challenges and increase services in Massachusetts, recently announced it received a \$15,000 grant from the Perigee Fund to help start culturally-specific, new parent support groups in

Massachusetts, which may become a national model.

Mass. PPD Fund recruited professionals and community leaders who work closely with new parents in different capacities to work with GPS Group Peer Support to do professional development in running support groups, as well as with the Boston Public Health Commission's Healthy Start Initiative, South Cove Community Health Center, and Propa City Community Outreach.

Mass. PPD Fund Executive Director Jessie Colbert noted, "As with

many other health and mental health issues, the pandemic has both exacerbated and brought to light significant need and health disparities in new parent mental health in Massachusetts and nationwide."

Urban Edge Names Deputy Director

Urban Edge, a Boston-based community development nonprofit that aims to strengthen communities and families in the Boston neighborhoods of Jamaica Plain and Roxbury, recently announced it appointed Richard E. relationships with community partners and residents involved in wealth-building and affordable housing.

Prior to his most recent role as founder and president of Verge Philanthropy Partners, Ward was vice president for strategic partnerships at Neighborhood Health Plan, where he built relationships with more than 50 community health centers across the region. He is an alumnus of Boston University.
